### 2010 Facts and Format

**Dates:** June–July

**Sites:** Nine sites nationwide

**Format** The summer's schedule features eight 54-hole (three-day) and one 36-hole (two-day) competition, as well as the 72-hole flagship event, the 35th Junior PGA Championship at Sycamore Hills Golf Club in Fort Wayne, Ind., Aug. 2-5.

The first nine events will serve as Junior PGA Championship qualifiers.

The five new venues on the PGA Junior Series schedule are: Windyke Country Club in Memphis, Tenn.; Fox Run Golf Club in Eureka, Mo.; Oak Tree Country Club in Edmond, Okla.; Stow Acres Country Club in Stow, Mass. and Yahara Hills in Madison, Wis.

Also planned for the summer schedule are PGM/career awareness promotions at the Kentucky, Nebraska, Colorado, Oklahoma and Pennsylvania sites.

**Rules and Regulations** The Rules of Golf, which govern play, are determined by the United States Golf Association (USGA) and applied by the PGA of America Board of Directors. The PGA Junior Series is subject to the overall supervision of the Board and the PGA Rules Committee.

**Eligibility** Each PGA Junior Series event is open to boys and

girls who are at least 13 years of age and under 19 years of age on the final day of any event they enter. Approximately one-half of the field consists of competitors residing within the host PGA Section of the competition. Competitors may enter as many events as they wish. Each series event will feature a field of approximately 156 players. Juniors may enter as many events as they wish. The event fields are based on playing ability and are not first-come, first-served.

Each PGA Junior Series event has two age groups for both boys and girls: 13-15 and 16-18.

**Junior Golf from Coast to Coast** Nationally recognized by both the *Golfweek* Sagarin Points System and Junior Golf Scoreboard, the PGA Junior Series debuted in the summer of 1996. The program has attracted boys and girls representing 50 states, the District of Columbia, 24 countries/territories and six continents.

The PGA Junior Series provides affordable and competitive playing opportunities for boys and girls between the ages of 13-18. Some top players have received full-to-partial golf scholarships to NCAA colleges and universities. Through 2009, the PGA Junior Series had visited 41 states and 38 PGA Sections. An average of 20 states were represented at each event site in 2009. The PGA Junior Series is organized and conducted by The PGA of America, with the support of PGA Professionals.

**Series Benefits** Each PGA Junior Series event will award points to the Top 10 finishers in the 13-15 and 16-18 age groups in both the boys' and girls' divisions. Points are compiled by The PGA of America through event No. 9 of the Series for Player of the Year honors. Each boys' 16-18 age division winner and the overall girls' division winner from each event of the PGA Junior Series will earn a berth in the 2010 Junior PGA Championship.

Point distribution for each Series event is as follows: 1st: 375 points, 2nd: 180 points, 3rd: 160 points, 4th: 140 points, 5th: 120 points; 6th: 100 points, 7th: 80 points, 8th: 60 points, 9th: 40 points, 10th: 20 points.
